For your review, I have included a few of this month's updates below:

Academic Excellence: Congratulations are in order for Ms. Erika Hall, Centennial's Department of Special Education Lead Teacher, as she has been selected as a member of the **National Charter Collaborative Special Education Community of Practice** for the 2021 calendar year! Ms. Hall, along with our Lower Academy Assistant Principal Mr. Ereco Maddox, will have an opportunity to partner with New York University's Metro Center for Research on Equity and the Transformation for Schools. Centennial will also receive a monetary grant award of \$25,000.

Kudos to Centennial's STEAM Specialist, Ms. Summer Blackmon, for receiving an **Alliance Theatre Institute Scholarship!** This partnership will allow Centennial scholars to receive a free Slam Poetry virtual workshop this spring. We are excited to welcome our Alliance Theatre Teaching Assistant to Centennial as we continue to serve as champions for Arts Education!

School Culture: This month, scholars will be exposed to learning about ancestors of various genres and make comparisons to the world in the present day as a part of Centennial's Black History Month Celebration. Scholars will also have an opportunity to learn ways to persevere during the face of adversity and feel empowered to make positive contributions to the world as an embodiment to our theme, "I Am My Ancestors' Wildest Dreams!" Professional Capacity:

Last Monday, we released our 21-22 employment contracts to all eligible 10-month employees. After only one week, we have already received a return of 85% acceptances. The deadline for submission is this Friday and I will provide an additional update next month. We will extend contracts to all eligible 12-month employees on April 1st.

Community Partnerships: Centennial Academy will continue to cultivate family and community partnerships to ensure success for every scholar.

- Today, Centennial Academy hosted our own Immunization Mobile Clinic Event. We are thankful to our partners
 at the Children's Hospital of Atlanta (CHOA) and The Ronald McDonald Care Mobile Team for working
 with our school nurse, Ms. Karesia Davis, to make this event possible!
- This semester, our 4th grade scholars will be engaging in a Glider Project with the Daniel Guggenheim
 School of Aerospace Engineering at Georgia Tech. In this project, our scholars will learn more about the
 engineering design process and practice applying problem solving and critical thinking skills through the
 design, build, and test of a small glider aircraft.
- Centennial's 8-week artist residency with the Children's Museum of Atlanta and cellist Okorie Johnson is now underway! Scholars will work with Okorie Johnson to expose them to music creation and composition, culminating in a performance of the music created during the residency.

Reopening Update:

As we plan for a safe return to campus for in-person learning, Centennial is continuing to monitor the trend data in the number of new COVID-19 cases in Fulton County. The first two health data checks conducted on January 18th and February 1st indicated that the levels were still in the substantial spread category (*over 100 cases per 100K reported*), 868 and 566 respectively. As of today, the reported cases per 100,000 in Fulton County is 443 per the Georgia Department of Public Health. This represents a steady decline over the past few weeks. We are hopeful that the data will allow for an eventual safe return to in-person learning for staff and the 31% of scholars who have elected to return to the building. However, we remain extremely cautious and will continue to prioritize the health, safety, and wellbeing of our entire community.

At the end of my last Head of School Report, I included a teaser video for our STEAM City PBL Presentations. Our educators have now launched the projects for the second semester.
