



Transitional Scholars


- Less than 1% Transitional scholar tested for DRC Beacon in Winter AND Spring
- Mass quarantine for Covid-19 outbreaks at the facility
- My Sister's House
 - Enrolled spring administration 2022
 - 17% took both ELA & Math DRC Beacon in Spring
 - 17% took ELA DRC Beacon in Spring
 - 59% took Math DRC Beacon in Spring
- Achievement
 - ELA
 - 80% Near Target
 - 20% Support Needed
 - Math
 - 20% Near Target
 - 80% support Needed

Data Sources to support Subgroups

- Advanced Pathways
 - 41% of AP scholars are participating in Beast Academy, an advanced comic-based math program for scholars ages 6-13
 - Anova: Two-Factor Without Replication: compares a group of individuals performing more than one task
 - In Grade 3, despite a few scholars having positive significant differences in level, attendance, and homework, the DRC Beacon math outcome remained the same at Near Target
 - In Grades 4 and 7, significant attendance (usage) yielded a Near Target outcome
 - There were no significant findings in Grades 5 and 6.
 - Findings: Regardless of Beast Academy (a) participation, (b) homework or (c) level achieved, achievement outcomes in DRC Beacon showed no significant impact
- CPA
 - Participation in additional programs
 - 9% Saturday Academy
 - 20% during March Madness Saturday Academy
 - 22% for upcoming SIA

Strategic Interventions for 22/23 (Subgroups)

- Transitional
 - Continue focus with MSH. Program geared for longevity
 - Coordinate with MSH Educational Coordinator
 - Outreach to families
 - Attend school in the building
 - Phone calls to discuss grades
 - In-person conferencing
 - Tutoring offered at MSH
 - Technology support from CA
- Advanced Pathways
 - Providing additional PD for teachers of AP scholars
 - Refine the use and efficacy of existing programs
- CPA
 - Collaboration with the Community Engagement Specialist (parent meetings, incentives, programs)
 - Mandatory Attendance meeting with parents
 - Mentor program
 - Special open House just for CPA residents

- Data Sources to support Science & Social Studies
 - 21/22 K-2 social studies assessment calendar did not align with content-driven scope and sequence
 - 25% of Learning Targets met Evident or Somewhat Evident Status in Upper Academy for Spring EOY
- Strategic Interventions
 - Intentional about merging STEAM with science and social studies success
 - Continue OutTeach (k-5): program designed to bring interdisciplinary connections into the science classroom (engagement)
 - Consider expanding OutTeach to upper academy
 - Continued implementation of Learning Targets K-8




