We are one week away from the conclusion of our first quarter! As we continue to make progress towards our strategic goals, please note pertinent updates below:

## Academics:

Initial **MobyMax Assessments** for all scholars, Kindergarten - 8th grade, have concluded and the data has been shared in this month's Academic Accountability Report. Centennial's principal, Dr. Cynthia Hudson, has presented the instructional strategies that the team in now employing including daily Intervention/Enrichment Blocks for all scholars, weekly Tutorial Sessions, and monthly Saturday Academy Workshops.

Our Instructional Team visited Powder Springs Elementary School for a day-long demonstration of the **ArtsNow** arts-integration program. Centennial received a \$15,000 grant from the Connolly Foundation to implement a carefully structured arts-based pedagogy that promotes collaboration, creative and critical thinking, and will aid in our ability to apply principles across different disciplines. The Instructional Team is currently developing a professional development plan that will support not only our new Arts Integration Specialist, Ms. Summer Blackmon, but also a self-selected cohort of 20 teachers to learn arts-integration strategies for classroom implementation. # Student Life & Leadership:

Our **Scholar-Athletes** have been fully immersed in sports during Quarter One including flag football, cross country, and cheerleading. Our Athletic Director, Coach Paul Skowronski, is currently leading tryouts for girls and boys basketball. Through our partnership with the Arthur Blank YMCA, we are saving costs this year by holding practices in the YMCA gymnasium which cuts down on travel and rental expenses associated with the prior use of Central Park Gymnasium. Be on the lookout for the basketball schedule and we look forward to seeing you all in the stands cheering on our heroes!

**Scholar Clubs** will kick off upon return from Fall Break. This year, we are offering a variety of clubs aligned with our Strategic Goals including STEM Club hosted by Georgia Tech, Student Ambassadors, Girl Scouts, Cub Scouts, Girls Who Code, Girls on the Run, Beta Club, Academic Bowl, Safety Patrol, Helen Ruffin Reading Bowl, and Junior Coaches.

This past Saturday, our Arts Integration Specialist, Ms. Blackmon held an open casting call for **The Wiz** Auditions. Over 65 scholars participated by performing 2 minute monologues, songs, or dances. Selected scholars will be announced this week! ### School Culture & Community:

Scholars and staff are equally excited about this week's **Homecoming** Festivities! Scholars will engage in various spirit activities throughout the week commencing with our Homecoming Flag Football against Westside Atlanta Charter on Friday night at Badgett Stadium. **Red Ribbon Week** is the oldest and largest drug prevention awareness campaign in the United States. Centennial will formally observe Red Ribbon Week from October 28 - November 1, 2019. During Red Ribbon Week, scholars will focus on drug, alcohol, and tobacco prevention, mental and physical health, as well as bullying prevention. An **APS Facility Assessment** was conducted last week by Parsons/MGT. The facility assessment consisted of two components, condition and educational suitability. The MGT Consulting Group met with Ms. Hodges and reviewed the educational components of the school and conducted a building tour to determine future building sustainability. A report from Parsons/MGT will be prepared and shared with APS at a future date.
